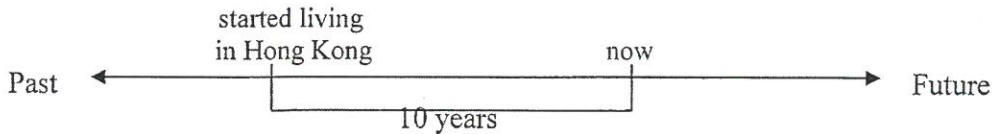

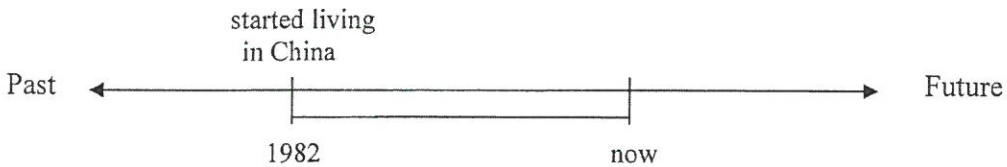

Lesson 1: Present Perfect Tense

- Present perfect tense is made up of two parts: the verb 'to have' + **past participle of main verb**
- Present perfect tense is used when an action *started in the past* and *is continuing now*.



e.g. I *have lived* in Hong Kong *for* ten years. (i.e. still live in Hong Kong now)



e.g. Jenny *has lived* in China *since* 1982. (i.e. still live in China now)

e.g. go, went, gone
